

Google Sites: *About Me* Page

It's all about you! One of the most important aspects of any website is the 'About Me' page as they are a great way to introduce yourself to your audience! On your Google Site, please take some time designing your website. After deciding on a color scheme and overall website theme, create a new tab for your 'About Me' page. Each page should *at least* include the following:

- One photo of yourself (you can include multiple photos if you choose)
- Three words/phrases used to describe yourself to “hook” your audience.
- Four paragraphs describing:
 - One: General Info - use this to tell us about yourself, including info on family and pets. You can also talk about where you live, your birthday, and age.
 - Two: Likes - what are somethings you *love* that we have to know about? Tell us about your favorite color, books, music, hobbies, and more!
 - Three: Future goals - what are your plans after high school? Do you plan to move to another state? What goals do you have for this school year? Goals can be both personal and academic focused
 - Four: Modern Media - what do you hope to learn from this class? Is there a particular project or software that interests you?
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Please remember to use correct spelling and punctuation!
